

FOLEY RAILROAD STATION

Stop in at the historic depot and explore several attractions.

Foley's Model Train Exhibit delights kids of all ages with an impressive O gauge train display that includes a quarter mile of track. It is considered one of the top public exhibits of toy trains in the country, thanks to the efforts of the Caboose Club, the group of volunteers who operate the exhibit. It's open Tuesdays, Thursdays and Saturdays, 10 a.m. - 2 p.m.

All aboard! Enjoy a train ride around Heritage Park. Weather permitting, free rides are offered every Saturday, 10 a.m.–2 p.m., year-round, and Tuesdays and Thursdays, 10 a.m.–2 p.m., during the summer months. Board in front of the Depot Museum at 125 E. Laurel Ave.

This 487-acre preserve serves as Foley's back yard, offering rustic hiking trails, a kayak launch, archery ranges, disc golf courses, an interpretive nature center and wetland boardwalk all located in pristine surroundings. Here you'll find a quiet space to enjoy wildflowers, bird watching and a nice sunset—or an idyllic setting for outdoor experiences on the creek or trails. WOLF CREEK PARK

This almost-hidden park provides access to Wolf Creek, offering a kayak launch for non-motor vessels. The boardwalk through the beautiful wetland of cypress trees opens to the main channel for fishing and bird watching.

HOLMES MEDICAL MUSEUM

Visit Baldwin County's first hospital, which served this area from 1936 until 1958. Take the self-guided tour to learn about medical equipment and patient rooms as they would have appeared in the 1930s and '40s. Open Monday through Saturday, 10 a.m.–3 p.m. Located at 111 W. Laurel Ave. Foley, Alabama.



Take a walk along the Wilbourne Antique Rose Trail and enjoy the delicate beauty and fragrance of hundreds of heritage roses. The nearly mile-long trail follows a path parallel to Highway 59 through historic Foley, and is open from dawn until dusk. Ample parking is available at Heritage Park. Roses are at peak bloom in early spring, but the nicely landscaped trail is a lovely place for walking throughout the year. www.VisitFoley.com
